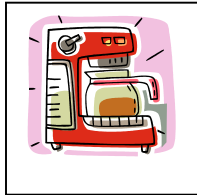
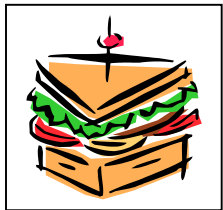

What to expect from the Kitchen

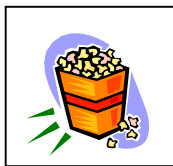
Every day that we are able to work in the field, a hot breakfast will be available at 7:00am. Group leaders would like the trucks to be on the road by 8:00am maybe earlier during hot weather. If weather does not permit an early morning, breakfast will run later. The morning of departure and every morning, continental breakfast will be available as early as 6:00am. Coffee, juice, milk and hot water will always be available. If you prefer instant coffee or you have a favorite tea, be sure to bring it.



Lunches will be packed by each camper to take on their day's adventure. Every morning each person will be responsible for making your own sandwich, choosing a snack for that afternoon and marking your bag. Lunches in the dining room will allow a change from sandwiches to soups, salads, baked potato bar, Etc. If you choose to snack on dehydrated fruit or jerky remember that you now have to hydrate those foods by drinking water.



Most evenings, dinner will be around 6:30. You can expect your typical "Home Cooking"; Stew, pasta, chili, and meat "potatoes kind of stuff" and salad bar. If you have any special needs or food allergies, please note it on your registration form.



Snacks will be available at all of the evening programs. The kitchen will not supply soda of any kind. If you are used to drinking pop, feel free to bring as much as you want. There is plenty of room for any amenities you choose to bring. Air tight or refrigerated storage is recommended for any food because of the local rodents and insects. The kitchen will be accessible around the clock.

Cleaning up is for every body but not every day. One day out of your stay you will be asked to be in the dining room a little early and stay a little later to help with last minute prep and cleanup.
